The season in review

Season 23/24 begin with a significant upgrade/overhaul to the Premiere and district structure from the senior men's committee along with the addition of play HQ.

The senior committee faced some growing pains relation to both, but in the end, due to the effort put in by all the senior committee were able to launch and successfully start the season.

As we approached finals we worked through a significant weather challenge which again saw the senior committees effort and expertise called upon to ensure continuity and a successful final series and conclusion to the season.

Our T-20 competition also was given a significant upgrade, and re-launched again in big Bash format, which proved to be an unwavering success. The focus for season 24/25 is to build upon our learnings within this framework, expand the competition yet again. Congratulations to Damian Ford specifically on a job very well done.

Our juniors completed yet again, another successful season lead strongly by Sean, Bill and a very capable committee. Although we saw 5% reduction in overall playing numbers, our

focus is to ensure we work with all aspects of the junior game to retain our current players, but also to expand the funnel to attract new ones.

Women's competition continues to go from strength to strength moving from three grades to 4 grades on a Sunday and included inaugural mid week T20 competition.

That women's competition continues to lead the way in the outer east with new clubs, joining every year. Melbourne's most successful community women's competition.

How veterans competition holds firm, but we look to put a plan in place in season 24,25 to potentially increase those numbers.

Lastly after holding a successful SGM to consider applications from two clubs to join the RDCA in season 24,25, the RDCA would also like to formally welcome to our association, Heatherdale and Vermont, cricket clubs.

Looking Forward Season 24/25

The ongoing implementation of play HQ into modern cricket, will still be a challenge for some in season 24/25.

The RDCA of knowledge is that and will continue to do everything at Ken to streamline and minimise any impact to committee members and clubs as this journey continues.

The board continues to take actions in direct alignment with the RDCA's strategic plan which will see us put to the clubs our revised constitution in the coming months for approval as we move into our next phase of growth.

The RDCA is strongly committed to providing clubs and its committee volunteers with administrative support to ensure the competitions longevity and to ensure at a club committee level communication with the RDCA is professionalised as much as possible to make Club volunteer life as easy as possible as well as saving time.

Our T-20 competition is primed for significant expansion in team Numbers as it is our women's competition, and we look forward to that continued growth.

Your seniors and juniors will follow through with their current format and consolidate with numbers at this stage, looking to hold firm or potentially slightly increase.

We look forward to working with our umpires committee through our senior committee are doing everything we can to not only stabilise umpire numbers, but also to add to umpires numbers for season 24/25 and beyond.

The overarching theme for the board in this coming year, will be consolidation and implementation of existing strategies to ensure the continued success and growth of the RDCA.

On a personal level, I would like to thank you all for your friendship and your continued support, and I look forward to serving you all again in the coming season.

Finance Manager - Graeme Seymour

Season 2023/24 was another very successful season for the RDCA with even the "Weather Gods" smiling on us with minimal games or round interruptions during the Season.

Financially, 2023/24 was also a very successful year. Income (excluding Umpire Match Day Fees where we only act as a collection & payment facility for all RDCA Umpires) increased from \$362,071 (2023) to \$402,193 this year.

Major revenue increases being Ball Sales \$206,886 (\$180,931), Sponsorship Income \$66,681 (\$58,794), T20 Competition Registration Fees \$11,273 (\$8,455), Interest \$4,193 (\$559). The only significant reduction in revenue was the absence of any Government or Cricket Victoria Grant monies this year. (\$7,500 in 2023)

Expenditure increased from \$347,202 (2023) to \$388,791 this year. The major increases being Ball Purchases \$197,383 (\$174,603), Honorariums \$38,950 (\$31,450), Junior Girls Academy costs (a new RDCA initiative this season) \$4,545 (\$0), Equipment, Clothing & Trophy costs \$39,235 (\$34,141).

For the year ended 31st May 2024, the RDCA has recorded a Surplus of \$13,402 for the year (\$14,799 in 2023). This result was just ahead of my budget projections & should be considered a very good result.

At year end we have Cash Reserves of \$161,654 (\$150,605 last year) & negligible debt. This places us in an extremely strong position to enter into season 2024/25 & beyond where we are going to face many changes, not the least of which will be the need to give future consideration to the appointment of a full time/part time RDCA Administration Manger to lessen the workload on the many Volunteers currently giving of their time to keep the RDCA functioning effectively. I am sure that other people will speak to this issue either tonight or in the various forums during the course of the coming season.

In closing my report for 2023/24 I would like to thank all the Association's sponsors for their continuing support, both in cash & kind. Without these sponsors & all the Association & Club Volunteers, the RDCA would not be the pre-eminent Metropolitan Cricket Competition that is today.

On a personal note, I would also like to thank all Club Treasurers for their co-operation during last season.

VMCU - Pat Meehan

Pat Meehan continued to represent the RDCA as our delegate to this body.

The VMCU consists of a Board made up of the 8 Directors of each Metropolitan Region, together with delegates from every Metropolitan Cricket Association. Pat Meehan is both the Director – Outer East on the Board and the RDCA Delegate.

Over the past season the main cricket activities relate to the management and implementation of metropolitan cricket. The VMCU Carnival proceeded in January 2024 with 106 teams competing, including 34 girls teams, and having 1,300 approx. players from 12 Associations in 10 grades. The RDCA was strongly represented with 10 teams entered in all grades. Success came with premierships in both the U/16 Mackay and U/14 Nolan Shields, runners up in both U/16 Beitzel and U/12 Fatone Shields, with another two teams competing in the semi-finals – U/18 Arnold and U/17 Jones Shields. A huge thanks are extended to all the players, coaches, managers, parents and umpires for their significant contribution to this very successful Carnival.

The most significant matters dealt with during the season were:

- Implementation of Australian Cricket's Child Safety Framework by all Associations and clubs to meet the updated Victorian Child Safe Standards, especially the appointment of Child Safety Officers at all clubs state-wide. Clubs need to formally minute the adoption of the "Safeguarding Children Policy" to CV before the commencement of each season. Monitoring the progress of the implementation within each Association is ongoing. This season all RDCA clubs were compliant.
- Continuing negotiations with CA/CV on PlayHQ and OfficialsHQ (with the latter being for umpires appointments and administration) on the need to address many issues experienced during the implementation phase. As part of these packages, relevant fees have been set by CA/CV for insurance, player registration and administration. All players senior and junior both male and female must register online through PlayHQ with the appropriate payments made before they can play in the next season. The VMCU Board is monitoring the implementation progress with CV Management, particularly on the many issues raised by Associations and clubs. To assist the VMCU is proposing to get a group of relevant people together to discuss the matters to present a united front to CV.
- Discussions are continuing with the VCCL on the annual match with the VMCU, including appropriate age group and format. The aim would be to play such a match in early February each year.
- Regular updates have been held with CV staff on organisational changes, cricket participation statistics, schools and cricket blast programs, available cricket grants to clubs and associations, the interaction with the Premier Pathway, Premier Cricket and the VMCU Junior Carnival and CV annual strategic plans for next season. A new CV Premier Pathway, incorporating U/15, U/16 and U/18 female and male groups, is being reviewed after this season's competition. The VMCU Board is ensuring that the role played by the VMCU Junior Carnival, or Associations in the development of junior cricket and representative opportunities, is considered during their review process to compliment and not compete for

Associations junior players, especially with fixturing of matches during the Carnival two-week period.

- Following the identification of the loss of association volunteers and the difficulty in finding replacements, the Board suggested to CV Management that paid replacement administrators appeared to be the best option for the near future. A couple of Associations initiated this option during the season using either their own funding or levying clubs. Some success has been reported. CV staff will be available to assist in the selection process (without any specific CV funding). The RDCA is currently investigating possible options and funding methods for a paid administrator to determine the RDCA position to ultimately be put to all clubs.
- Litigation by an NMCA club following both a lengthy player and possible club suspensions after unsuccessful Association and VMCU appeals. VMCU was involved as a party, with substantial costs, in the court proceedings. Clearly all Associations need to ensure that they have rigid processes in place for dealing with Tribunal and Appeals processes to negate any possible litigation. In addition, processes for appeals on player points systems is also required.
- Discussion on disciplinary issues with players and clubs with suspensions, bonds, etc., who can participate in different associations, including winter competitions, has recently been undertaken due to some concerns and the need to share information. This would involve assessing the PlayHQ process and the possible need to have this information on the VMCU website to assist all relevant parties. This is ongoing.

In addition, the VMCU is also the body which deals with both club and player appeals against penalties imposed by an Association, which if it meets the criteria, would be considered by its independent panel for final resolution.

Outer East Metro - Pat Meehan

Pat Meehan continued as Director- Outer East Metro Region on the VMCU Board.

The Outer East Region covers the municipalities of Knox, Maroondah and Yarra Ranges and comprises of clubs in the Ringwood and District Cricket Association (VMCU Affiliate) and the Ferntree Gully Cricket Association (VCCL Affiliate). The RDCA received significant recognition by being named as the "Cricket Association of the Year" in Cricket Victoria's Community Cricket Awards for season 2022/23. This season the RDCA had 58 clubs with 151 senior teams, 230 junior teams (male and female), 31 women's teams and 35 veterans teams with 4,800+ overall participants. The RDCA Headquarters moved to the Board Room and Office upstairs in the new R O Spencer Pavilion at Jubilee Park, Ringwood (together with Ringwood Cricket Club and CV regional staff).Premier Cricket is represented in the region by Ringwood Cricket Club with the Victorian Sub-District Cricket Association represented by both Bayswater and Croydon Cricket Clubs.

C V staff operating in the region for the season were Clinton Kennon / Mark Freeman, Area Manager - Stars and Stephen Box, Cricket Manager- Outer East Metro. These people assisted all clubs and work closely with them and schools in the region to offer a program of

clinics, competitions, and activities to increase the availability of cricket in various formats to both male and female participants.

Ringwood C.C. is our partner for the regional pathway program and assists in the management and coaching of the Outer East Eagles male and female squads in the State Championships. The Annual RCC v RDCA match was played at Jubilee Park, main oval, on Wednesday 7th February 2024, with the RCC winning in 18.1 overs. Hopefully a RDCA Womens East match will be played against RCC Women in 2025.

The region was strongly represented in the VMCU Junior Carnival held in January 2024 as the RDCA entered 10 male and female teams in all grades and FTGDCA entered 7 teams (6 male and 1 female). A total of 107 teams competed. RDCA were the premiers in the U/16 Mackay and U/14 Nolan Shields and runners up in the U/16 Beitzel and U/12 Fatone Shields with another three teams competing in the semi-finals in U/18 Arnold, U/16 Beitzel, U/17 Jones Shields. The FTGDCA were runners up in the U/18 Arnold the U/16 Mackay Shields with the U/12 Mitchell Shield team competing in the semi-final. Huge thanks are extended to all players, parents, players, managers, coaches, and umpires for their significant contribution to this successful Carnival.

Women's cricket continues to grow within the region both at Premier Cricket level with RCC and the Associations. The RDCA girls competition had 35 teams in 4 grades. The standard is also improving as evidenced with some Stage 3 girls players making their debuts in women's teams. The RDCA managed the "RDCA Women's East" competition again this season to provide a pathway for allow all women and junior girls in both the Outer and Inner East Regions to participate in cricket at all skill levels. This resulted in 17 clubs entering 31 women's teams in 5 grades including 21 teams from RDCA and 3 teams from FTGDCA. FTGDCA conducted a fortnightly T20 social sixes competition with 9 teams competing, including 3 teams who previously played in the Women's East competition. Many of these were new teams included women who have never played cricket before and Stage 3 girls. This was once again highly successful with many other clubs from Associations indicating that they hope to enter teams in this competition next season. In addition 4 teams entered the inaugural mid-week T20 competition with Bayswater Park winning.

In the Men's competition the top grades (Premier 1 and 2) played a mix of two day and one day matches with the lower grades (District 1 and2) playing all one day matches, including finals. Thankfully, the season and all finals were successfully completed with minimal impact on team numbers. Next season hopefully all grades can play a mixture of both two day and one day matches (including resuming split innings in some lower grades). A successful T20 competition open to teams from adjacent associations had 32 teams competing with Lilydale (RDCA) winning over South Belgrave(FTGDCA) in the final. At this time 50 teams have indicated that they will participate next season.

We again had 24 divisions of cricket playing for premierships and we had 15 different clubs win Grand Finals. A strong boys and girls program ensured that Warranwood defended their Junior Club Championship award. Congratulations to all the Sharks who helped their club earn enough points to win this award.

I gained such joy out of my junior cricket and Maree is supportive of me contributing back. My 2 boys have loved their junior cricket and I love nothing better than seeing a close game of junior cricket!

Finally I thank our clubs. We are all on the same team, the team of cricket. I am honored to be the President of the RDCA Junior Competition and thank you all for your support.

Junior Secretary - Bill Stafford

During the off-season clubs had the extra challenge of learning all about PlayHQ, which was the new cricket operating system replacing MyCricket. PlayHQ and Cricket Victoria ran a number of training sessions covering such topics as setting up your Club, registering players, setting up teams, e-scoring, etc. PlayHQ also provided one on one support and an online help desk. Whilst there were a number of bugs that had to be resolved, causing some frustrations to clubs, the transition to PlayHQ went relatively smoothly and the clubs are to be commended for all the extra work required and getting the season set up and running on PlayHQ. From my point of view PlayHQ offers a number of additional administration features such as fixturing, which makes much this time-consuming task much easier.

This season we finished up with 230 teams, which is a drop from last season's 251 teams. Over the past 9 years there has been a general increase in teams and to have a reduction of 21 teams is a worrying sign. A number of clubs withdraw teams very close to the start of the season, as they were unable to get sufficient numbers. Particularly in the mini bash and the lower U/12 grades, which will impact u/14 and U/16 team numbers in future years.

The number of girls teams held steady with 36 teams. This season we moved away from two Stage 1 Spirit (non-competitive) grades to a Spirit and Stars (competitive grade) grade. In Stage 2 a number of the better teams were encourage to move to Stage 3, as there were insufficient Stage 2 Stars and Stage 3 teams. This resulted in only one grade in Stage 2.

Our umpiring numbers continue to grow with umpires being appointed to the top 3 grades of U/12, U/14 and U/16 and Stage 3 girls. In a number of U/12 games we were able to appoint two umpires. Thanks to Doug Dowling for the many hours, he has spent in organising and coordinating our umpires.

This season unfortunately we have seen an increase in behavioural issues, mainly parents behaving badly. It will be something we will need to address going into next season to ensure clubs/teams are onboard in enforcing the RDCA code of conduct.

WOMENS COMPETITION REPORT

Season 2023-24 saw an expanded RDCA Women's East competition, moving from 3 grades to 4 on a Sunday, and included an ungraded mid-week T20 competition. This expansion afforded us with options to involve more women in community cricket. Our D Grade became a T20 only grade, with opportunities for double headers at each club. In turn, this led to the development of a close group of players new to cricket.

Like our counterparts in the Seniors competition, we were affected by the introduction of Play HQ to replace MyCricket, and adverse weather, with rain in the early part of the season, and an unprecedented heat wave during the semi-finals, forcing us to abandon play altogether. We progressed those teams which finished in the top two of their respective tables at the end of the home and away season into the Grand Finals. Once again, our congratulations to Mooroolbark's First XI (A Grade Premiers), Officer's First XI (B Grade Premiers), St Andrews' First XI (C Grade Blue), Kilsyth (C Grade White) and Wonga Park (D Grade).

Our presence in Melbourne's outer east has grown, with new clubs joining and existing clubs developing 2nd XI teams. Our Cricket Operations Manager conducted three workshops prior to the commencement of the season, which were designed to support clubs through the process of establishing a girls' and/or women's cricket program, and several of the clubs which attended these fielded teams in our Sunday or mid-week T20 Competitions. Additionally, the support from our local community cricket radio on Saturday mornings was a game changer in terms of raising our profile, with several of our captains and our Cricket Operations Manager featuring.

While keeping our focus on our core business, we were also able to deliver three workshops during the season for our captains, aimed at developing their understanding of their role both on and off the field.

Off the field, we continued our fortnightly newsletter, where we were able to celebrate milestones and personal achievements with our players and clubs, and continue to get to know more about our players both new and experienced. Again, the Newsletter helps us tell the stories behind the stats.

We continue to work with Cricket Victoria, our Board and other associations in Melbourne's east to implement Cricket Australia's 10 Year Plan for Women's (Community) Cricket, and the Victorian Government's Fair Access Policy, which came into effect on 1 July 2024.

As more and more RDCA Clubs develop girls cricket programs, we see the emergence of new and exciting junior talent in our women's competition, who, playing alongside some of our more established stars have provided those of us who are spectators some spectacular moments. The standard of play across all of our grades is definitely on the rise.

We thank our Board, the broader RDCA family, umpires and Cricket Victoria for their ongoing support and look forward to an equally successful 2024/25 season


